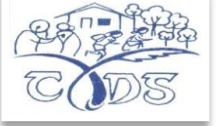

ANNUAL REPORT 2022- 23

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The reporting period is one of the most successful and productive year for Crescent Rainbow Home. The number of children staying in the home during the period under reporting are 81. Several activities carried out by the Home during the reporting period which were aimed at capacity building and confidence building among the children of the Home. We are herewith briefing different activities carried out by the Home during the period starting from 1st April 2022 and ending with 31st March 2023.

EDUCATIONAL AND ACADEMIC

A total of 81 students are staying in this home during the period under reporting. The period under reporting can be termed as a joyous period with several activities being organized followed by children's outing and capacity building training to the staff of the Home. The children studying in different classes are tabulated hereunder:

None of the children are in Bridge course during this period. The children had their examinations. Sincere efforts were made, both by the children as well as the teachers and the Home Managers, to ensure that the children prepare at their best for the examinations.

A special drive to improve the educational status of the children was held to ensure that the children are well prepared in academics. Based on their performance the children were grouped into A, B and C. Very special attention was paid for the children in the C group by providing extra efforts to provide them with attentive coaching in the subjects they are lagging behind. This helped the children to perform well in their examinations.

During the period under reporting, Crescent Rainbow Home got associated with Jan Shikshan Samsthan, Anantapur. With their support we have conducted different courses for the children in the Home. The courses included:

- Beautician Course
- Tailoring Course
- Basic Computer Course
- Spoken English Course.

These courses were of 3 months duration each. They helped the children a lot in gaining knowledge about a few employable trades when they grow up and want to settle-down on their own in their life. By improving their skills in these professions they can make an earning even when they sit at home, or they can find some private jobs in



technical or educational institutions. This will help their families to make some additional income and economically prosper.

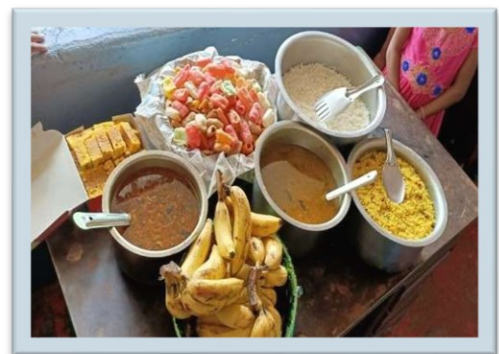


District Level Competition: On the occasion of Anantha Balotsavam in the month of on 28/01/2023 & 29/01/2023 our children, who are studying 7th, 8th and 9th classes, participated in District Level dance programmes. Twenty children from our Home participated in this programme in which they performed wonderfully. They were excited to participate in a District Level event, and won 1st prize for the speech about Environmental issues, 2nd prize for dance competition, and 2nd prize in Kolatam performance, Tarsha got 2nd prize for Padyalu in district level.

Crescent rainbow home children also participated in different District Level events held in Anantapur district. They performed well in Telugu padyalu, Deshabhakthi geethalu (Patriotic Songs) Essay writing topic on Ayushman Bharath Arogya yojana. They won 1st and 2nd prizes and also received certificates.

NUTRITIONAL AND HEALTH CARE

Balanced and nutritional diet is provided to the children to ensure that they maintain good health all the time. The Home changes the Menu once in every three months, and the preparation of the Menu is also done by involving the children. Food committee is constituted in the Home which helps the Home Mothers in keeping the kitchen clean, and also to promote hygienic practices among children - like washing hands before eating and after, with hand wash, cleaning vessels and cups and plates in hot water etc.



While eggs are given twice a week, non-vegetarian food is served once a week. Seasonal fruits are included in their meal at least three-times a week. Added to this, the Home is taking care to provide balanced diet by including greens and leafy vegetables in the daily intake of the children.

Special care is taken in the case of children who are sick and ill. For them the Home provides supplementary food items like Idly, Bread, Ragi malt, Dry Fruits, Milk, Seasonal fruits etc.

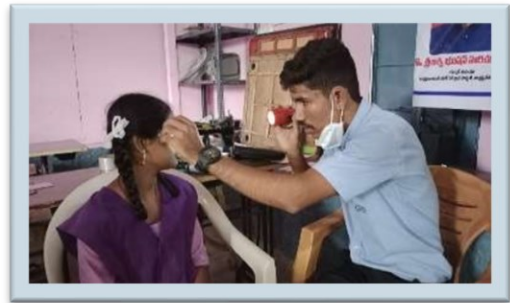
Periodical trainings are also given to the Home Mothers, at regular intervals, to prepare tasty and nutritious food for the children, and to take special care in hygiene.

Health and personal hygiene are the other fields of specific intervention in Crescent Rainbow Home. The children have inculcated the 'very best' habit of daily bath, compared to their earlier lifestyle where they used to have it once or twice in a week or so. This must be said to be as one of the major steps taken up by us towards promoting their personal Health and Hygiene.

It is remarkable that the promotion of good and disciplined food habits and following of hygiene practices have led to their physical development as well as health condition. The smiles on their faces are the symbol of their physical and mental health.

HEALTH STATUS

Continued care and follow-up on Health and Hygiene related issues is a part of home's manual. We ensured all children have daily bath, and home is cleaned and mopped daily to maintain hygiene. Similarly, tidiness of the clothes, regular and timely washing of school uniforms and casual wears, bedsheets are also paid utmost attention. It is worth mentioning that several skin-related problems were controlled to a maximum extent through these practices. Added to this, the Home is taking care to provide balanced diet by including greens and leafy vegetables in the daily intake of the children. We have conducted total 3 health checkup camps in our home for general checkup for on the occasion of 75th Independence Day conducting dental camp with the help of Global Social Cops for Peoples Organization and Eye checkup camp with the help of LV Prasad Eye Institution.



CHILDREN'S CLUBS

Children's Clubs are very much active in Crescent Rainbow Home. During the reporting period 6 children's clubs were formed i.e., Literacy club, sports club, laughing club cultural club, guardian club & drawing club. These clubs regularly functioning every fortnight.

- **Literacy club** is focusing on the children's Literacy and improve those children who are lagging behind in academic education. They are treated with special attention and are provided with additional coaching. The members of this club collect information from daily newspaper and share to all children.
- **Sports club** is concentrating about those who are interested in sports and games. They help them in practicing the sports and encourage to participate in sports and games in

the Home Compound, also in the events run outside i.e, in the schools and other places in the town.

- **Cultural club** concentrates and helps the children practice in cultural arts like dances, songs and mimicries etc., children those who are in the club are improving in their cultural skills.
- **Gardening club** is sowing plants and growth, concentrating on useful plants like vegetables, leafy vegetables.
- **Laughing club** is functional for those children who are moody and not mingling with other children. This club works to bring change in such of these children and tries to bring a visible change in their mood and behavior. They try to bring them into the mainstream and mingle with the rest of the children in the Home.

Children are very happy about these clubs; they eagerly wait for the activities of these clubs, on Sunday, and actively participate in the activities of these clubs. Children are joining in their respective clubs and heartfully participating and learning. Children are learning the activities at the same time they are enjoying not feeling bored.

CHILDREN PARTICIPATIONS & LEADERSHIP

According to Rainbow Home rules, changes need to be made in various children committees once in 3 months. Among all the clubs, Art and Craft club has performed to its best.

Balasabha: Regular sitting of Balasabha took place during the reporting period. It takes place every day. In Balasabha all children gather at one place and discuss about the things they have faced in the entire day. The children only will participate in the discussion, and no team members of the Home are allowed to listen during this period. Suggestions are given during the meet. If they are not getting suitable solution for the required questions, then they will ask team member's help. Every child participates in Balasabha without fail.



In Sister Groups, the elder children (elder sisters) help the younger children (younger sisters) in wearing dress, getting their hair style, maintaining tidiness and personal hygiene etc. Through this, the relationship between them gets stronger.

In the Art and Craft clubs, our children prepared beautiful club file in which they fixed / pasted crafts, arts designed by them along with a brief information about it.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Paintings and Drawings: It is important to keep children busy in extracurricular activities. These activities help them in their overall development. During the leisure periods, children spent time in preparing Art & Crafts, Paintings and Drawings. Our children prepared wall hangings with colorful papers. Those are looking very beautifully. They prepared all these materials with their own talent and due encouragement from the Home Management.



Sports & Games and Fine Arts: Sports and Games, and Fine Arts are a part of Home's activities. Children are trained in singing, dancing, and Martial Arts. It is made as a part of the curriculum of the Home. They were given physical exercise on every evening in the form of sports and games to help them to be strong in their physical fitness on one side and promoting competitive spirit on the other side.



LIFESKILL

Life skill session was taken once or twice in a month for children. Sessions were taken on various topics on Time Management and Self-confidence, Communication, Good habits, Hygiene, Behavior, Confident and Impressive Conversation, Goal setting, Critical thinking, Interpersonal relationship skills, Self-awareness building skills were explained to the children. Through the child realized the importance of values and how they are useful in real life. These life skill sessions were conducted by CRDS Rainbow home team members, external resource, Social Mobiliser.



MEETINGS AND TRAININGS

Parents Meetings: Parents was held three months once has the children's parents very busy with their work. As a part of this the Home has conducted quarterly parents' meeting after consulting with the parents. During these meetings the CRDS team members discuss about the child's growth, health,



education, and about the updating of their identity cards like Aadhar card and other necessary documents. The parents were also updated about providing training for degree children, shared children's report cards, their pictures and videos where they have participated at district level competitions and requested the parents to refer new children who are in need.

Every time, the meetings are concluded by taking feedback from the parents and Vote of thanks to the parents by the team members.

Fire Extinguish Training for Childrens: Multiple trainings were given to the inmate children of the Home on aspects like how to rescue themselves and save others during unforeseen accidents or incidents like fire accidents. Crescent Rainbow Home has fire-extinguishers place in appropriate place to meet any eventuality.

These children are explained about the process of using the fire extinguishers. This is the first aid response to fire and can help prevent catastrophic damage to property and even loss of life, need to remember the PASS method while using the fire extinguisher:



P – pulling the extinguisher pin, A – aiming the fire extinguisher low, S – squeezing the handle.

S – sweeping the extinguisher sidewise.

Child Safety and Protection Meeting for Team Members & Childrens: In another training all Rainbow Home Team members were involved along with the children. Mr. Leela Manohar was the resource person for this training. During this meeting, the resource has discussed on development of team work and non-Negotiable Rules. Parents quite naturally set non-negotiable rules when it comes to safety – we don't ask our children if they want to use a car-seat, the term 'all year groups' in this context for attendance purposes refers to children under 5 eligible for early years entitlements and children and young people aged (5 to 18). The restoration and protection of a child shall be the prime objective of a Children's Home/ Specialized Adoption Agency/ Open Shelter.

Street children face difficulties in providing themselves with good sources of food, clean drinking water, health care services, toilets and bath facilities, and adequate shelter. They also suffer from absence of parental protection and security due to the missing connection with their families.

Street children are minors who live and survive on the streets. They often grow up in public landfills, train stations, us under the bridges of the world's major cities. Because of conflicts with their family, these children don't want to or can't return home.

Vulnerable Groups: Learners with Special Educational Needs (SEN)/ Learning Difficulties and Disabilities (LDD), Looked after children, Children and young people living in poverty, Excluded pupils, and those at risk of exclusion, Pupil with behavior and attendance issues, Gypsy, Roma and Traveler pupils can be considerable under the vulnerable groups.

Training to Team Members on Different aspects: The Home is conducting trainings for the staff members for improving their life skills & capacity building purpose. Now totally we are conducting 3 capacity building programs for our staff members.

Team Meeting: We are conducting team meeting for every month. And we discussing about children's problems, and others. We are also discussing about how to improve home with facilities.

Awareness Program on CPC Committee & Life Skill Session for Children & Parents: CPC Committee and life skill session was organized for children and their parents at crescent rainbow home. The guests of this program were

Information on E- KYC - In other words, if we want to apply for government cards like Aadhaar Card and Bank Pass Book, we must have our fingerprints and facial movements were explained. It was also explained that if there is any problem in your area, tell them to the volunteer and they will upload it in the app called Waradhi , and after doing that, it will be solved immediately. In addition to this, every woman should download the app called Disha, which will help the police to immediately know if a woman is in danger, and can reach to protect the women in danger.



If girls want to achieve their goals, they should improve "Meru May's Life Skill and soft skill accordingly. If we have to pass the exam or interview, we have to improve our skills in various fields. She also explained that computer knowledge should be developed well. In addition to all these, it was explained that everyone's future also depends on communication skills , which is important for everyone. By learning self-introduction, the person's confidence levels increase and they will succeed in achieving success. The things mentioned as part of this training like - My Sweet / good name, from address, Father's Name, Mother's Name, Education / Qualification, Hobbies, family Background, Strength & Weakness Goal -

producing this information in a nice and confident way will win the confidence of others which in turn help in passing through the interviews etc.

INSPECTIONS

Vigilance Department's Inspection: On 31/03/2023 the Vigilance Department officials visited the Home and conducted an inspection at Rainbow home.

As part of this they also checked all the registers of the home. They was also inquired if all the facilities are available for the Home mothers and the children staying in the home.

After the visit to the Home, they also visited the office of CRDS, where they also checked all the registers related to the home, and also checked the account books, salary registers, audit reports of the home for the last 2 years.

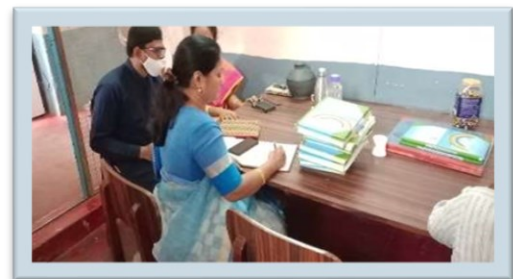


They also had interaction with the staff of the organization both at the Crescent Rainbow Home and also at the administrative offices of CRDS, and got an on hand information about the functioning of the organization as well as the Home.

District Inspection Committee's Visit: The District Inspection Committee, Anantapur has visited Crescent Rainbow Home. During the visited they have checked entire building and also verified different documents being maintained by the Home. They also Interacted with the children and rainbow home team members. They felt happy at the end of their inspection.



District CWC Committee Visit: On 6th January 2023 the Home was inspected by CWC, Anantapur. Mrs. Meda Ramalakshmi, the CWC Chairperson personally visited the Home and interacted with the children and staff. As part of this, they checked all registers, stock books and provision books. All other registers are also checked as per Form 46A.



Counselling For CWC Ordered Student: On 31st March 2023, the CWC Committee has visited and talked to CWC ordered child S. Ayesha, who is taken care by the Home as per the orders of CWC, Anantapur. They discussed about her wellbeing in the home and about her education and her goal to reach. They have imparted counseling to the child on these aspects, and how she should plan her future and shape herself to stand as a confident youth in the society.



CELEBRATIONS AND FESTIVALS:

A festival day, irrespective to which community it belongs to or celebrated, always brings a festive mood among the children in the Home. In the Home all the festivals and events are celebrated with equal involvement and enthusiasm. Several National and International events were organized in the home which were attended by all the children in the home along with the staff. The children will be provided with special food on these days, meetings will be organized on these events, cultural activities, performances of the students, wearing of new clothes by the children are the centre of attraction in such events. The events organized are listed hereunder to present an overview of the involvement of the children in these events and give them the opportunity to enjoy and exhibit their skills.

Events:

International Street Children' Day: On this day, the children were explained about the importance of the day and the need to safe-guard the street children by contacting different agencies if we notice any orphan child on the street. Information on dialing 1098 and 100 Disha police stations was shared. Later a rally was taken up in Lakshmi Nagar for about 1 Kilometer distance.



Ugadi celebration: Celebrated by decorating the home, preparing sweets and special food, and performing pooja.

Ambedkar Jayanthi: On April 14th Ambedkar Jayanthi was celebrated in the Home Campus, which was attended by all the children and the Home team.



Ramzaan and Bakrid Festival: On 3rd May Ramzan & on 10th July, Bakrid festivals were celebrated by the children in the Home.

International World Day Against Child Labour: On June 12th International World Day Against Child Labour was celebrated in the Home. The theme this year is Digital Generation. The context of the day and the theme was explained during the meeting organized in the Home premises



Independence Day: Live every year, this year also on 15th August the National Celebration of India – the Independence Day was celebrated by hoisting the Indian National Flag. All the children offered their respects to the Flag and their tributes to the leaders of Independence.

International YOGA Day: International Yoga Day was celebrated on 21 June 2022. CRDS has appointed a capable guru, who has good knowledge about the techniques involved in Yoga. During these classes the children were made to practice yoga (asan) and pranayam (breathing exercises) developed by the ancient yogis for regulating the vital energies in the body (pranayam). In his guidance the International Yoga Day was celebrated in the Home.



Shri Krishnashtami: On 19th August, 2022 Krishna Janmashthami was celebrated in the home with all religious fervor and discipline. All the children were new dressed and performed cultural shows on this occasion.



Ganesh Festival: On 31st August 2022, the Home made the occasion an unforgettable experience. The celebrations began with Pooja at 8.30am in which the Home Mothers, and other staff along with the children have participated. Dance performances marked the celebrations during which the guests were gifted traditional idol of lord Ganesh which was made with mud and painted in glitter.

Teacher's Day Celebrations: On the Occasion of Teachers Day, 5th September the children of Crescent Rainbow home have celebrated Teachers Day by spreading their love and affections towards home mothers and the Chief Functionary of CRDS Mr. Saddam. They also shared sweets and



chocolates with other children. The Children's delivered speeches and sung songs.

Gandhi Jayanthi Celebrations: On 2nd October, the occasion of Gandhi Jayanthi, children had given speeches and performed Dances. Prizes were distributed to the children for their best performances. On this occasion, garlanded to Gandhi photo and paid tributes on the mark of Gandhi Jayanthi. During this event the attended dignitaries delivered inspirational speeches about Gandhiji's life style and how he had fought for freedom of our country and emphasized that all should follow his guidelines/ideology that is only real tribute to Mahatma.



International Girl Child Day: On 11th October International Day of the Girl Child was celebrated in the Home. Being a Home specially for girls, the Home took the beauty of young girl happily enjoying the day and performing cultural activities and delivering speeches to raise the moral of Girls in the society.



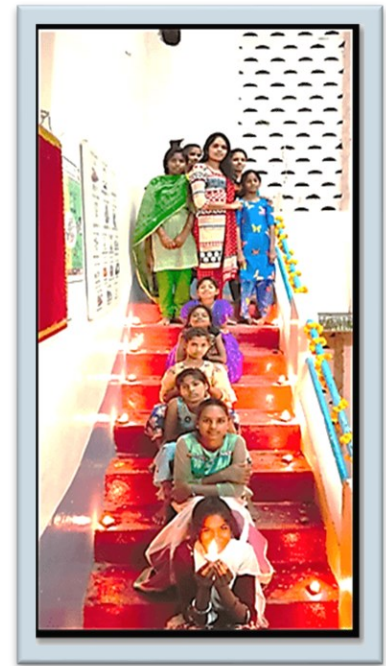

Deepavali: The festival of Diwali was celebrated on 22nd October. The management of CRDS has distributed Dry ration kits of two months to the families of the children. The chief guests present on this occasion were Mr. Amarnath Reddy (Manavatha Organization Blood Donor Convenor), Mr. S.M.Basha, Manava Hakkula Vedika, Mr. Ram Reedy, State ADCC Bank Director and all the sponsorship children along with their parents attended the (CBCP) Community Based Care Program at Rainbow Home Laxmi Nagar, Anantapur. The staff of CRDS also contributed to the joy to the children. Like any other festivals celebrated during the earlier months, the children had head bath, wear their good clothes and dressed up in a colorful dress. The staff of the Home also joined the celebrations by lighting Diya's in the evening and distributed sweets.



International Child Rights Day: On International Childrens Day and International Adoption month was celebrated at crescent rainbow home. The guests weree Dr. B.N. Sridevi-DWRCWEO, M. Ramalakshmi-CWC Chairperson, V.L. Kameshwari-Member CWC, Vishnu Vardhini- Supervisor, C. Sandhya Rani- LPO DCPU, D. Vasantha Lakshmi-ORW DCPU, G. Chnadrakala-PO (NIC0, K. Nagendra District Coordinator, Saddam Basha, CRDS Project Director, Pushpalatha-Home Management Coordinator, Shilpa- Home manager- 2, Roopa Sri-Future Focal Person. The chief guests spoke about the importance of child right day and their responsibilities.



Children's Day: On the occasion of Children's Day, it was celebrated in the presence of Home Project Director Mr. Saddam Basha, Education Co- Ordinator Sai Pavani, Home Management coordinator Pushpalata & Teacher Shilpa. Children got readily with colorful dresses. The students were explained ed about the contributions of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru to the nation. Programs like Singing, Dancing was conducted on this occasion and prize were distributed to the best performers. The program concluded with the distribution of sweets to all the children.



New Year Celebrations: January 1st 2023, celebrations were celebrated with lot of enthusiasm. The children studied for a while and then started preparation for New Year. Every child took a sheet paper and created greeting cards. In the evening cultural programs were organized. The children participated in dancing, singing, yoga, karate, art and craft. Everyone is talented and skillful within their respective field. They have their own talents which makes them proud and happy. The day ended with having delicious food and also with the new beginning of the year with full of dreams and goals.



Makar Sankranti Celebrations: On 14th January 2023, Bhogi fire was lit and children went round it, danced and sung. Home team explained about the importance of Bhogi. Later children were served with a bowl of pongal and chutney. Children felt very happy on this day.

A few children participated in drawing competition. Each child drew beautiful pictures on the chart by using pencils, color pencils, water paints and some other materials. The best presentation among the drawing got 1st prize and also for the children who participated in the competition got chocolates so that everyone was happy without any disappointment.



Subhash Chandra Bose Birthday Celebrations: Celebrated the birth anniversary of Subhash Chandra Bose, tributes were paid to his portrait by garlanding it. A few children gave speeches about the biography of Subhas Chandra Bose – the great Indian nationalist whose defiance of British authority in India made him a hero among many Indians.



National Girl Child Day: On 24th January 2023: National Girl Child day was celebrated in the Home. Children holding placards and chanting slogans held a rally to celebrate the National Girl Child Day. After coming back home, everyone stood and took the pledge. Later some children gave talk on the importance of National Girl Child Day.



Republic Day Celebrations: Like all the years, this year also on 26th January, Republic Day was celebrated in the Home. The ASP of 4th town police Station along with the Staff came to Rainbow Home and celebrated Republic Day. After hoisting the National Flag, the children have given impressive speeches. The police staff had given awareness to children on toll free number 100, and explained the sacrifices of the great leaders like Mahatma Gandhi, Tanguturi Prakasham Pantulu, Bala Gangadhar Tilak.



Mahatma Gandhi Death Anniversary: On 30th January the Home paid tributes to the Father of Our Nation, Mahatma Gandhi on his death anniversary. Speeches and remember the great things were the highlights of this even organized in the Home.

International Women's Day: On 8th March 2023 International Women's Day was celebrated in Home. The children were explained about Women Rights Movement and the rights of the women – i.e., gender equality, reproductive rights, and protection from violence and abuse against women.



Holi celebration: On March 18th, Holi, also known as the festival of spring or the festival of colors was celebrated with fun by the children. They smeared colors to each other and had great fun. It was a great colorful day for the children and for the home team watching them to play and enjoy.



Setting up of Learning Centre: On 09/09/2022, CBC In charge CT Desk Office Hyderabad Mr. Kranti visited Crescent Rainbow Home. As a part of this, Mr. Kranti discussed on how to start a learning center in Anantapur and the related matters were discussed in this meeting. Also, Kranti, Rainbow Home Project Director Saddam Basha, CBC Coordinator Sudarshan went to the area location and thought to set up one of them as a learning center.

HOME RENOVATION

As a part of providing an appealing environment where the children can stay and enjoy, several renovation activities were taken up in the Rainbow Home. As part of this, the rooms

in the home were painted and an iron grill was fixed around the outside wall of the shed on the floor.

Two types of painting and two exhaust fans were arranged for each room in the home. Also, an exhaust fan in the kitchen and a spigot at the gas stove to prevent hot air and smoke during cooking have also been installed. Exhaust fans were also installed in both the living rooms of the children so that the hot air does not circulate to the children in each room.



Tiles were laid in the bathroom, in the roof shed, on building top where cement flooring was there previously. This made this place suitable to sit and read with more comfort.






