INTRODUCTION

CRESCENT RURAL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY started to work on Rural Development issues since 1993. Initially, CRESCENT RURAL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY worked towards integrated Rural Development aspects in Anantapur Dist. of Andhra Pradesh. Anantapur district has a long and illustrious heritage of voluntarism starting from 1960. The pioneering works of voluntary organizations in the district involve models of organization, mobilization, and unionization of Agricultural laborers, Marginal farmers, marginalized sections of the society i.e. Dalits, and STs integrated Rural Development, Regeneration of women and children, Community health, AIDS Awareness, Watershed Development, Regeneration of De-graded lands and hillocks, etc.

Crescent Rural Development Society (CRDS) is a Non-governmental Voluntary Organization working in Anantapur District for the socio-economic upliftment of the socially and economically deprived people. With its main focus on children, child safety, child education, the organization is committed to the safety and security of the children and their families. The organization is running a Child Care Institution (CCI), exclusively for girls taking care of more than 110 girl children who are coming from deprived communities, singleparent children and parentless children, Homeless children. The "Rainbow Home" program was started in the year 2010 with 5 children in the freely offered house in the Driver's colony of Anatapuramu. Now the home has grown to a strength of 110 children over a period of 10 years with long-term care and protection. Ideally, a Rainbow Home is designed to cater to 100 children. Mostly, at any point of time, we have more than 100 children as we can't afford to ignore vulnerable children seen on the street or referred by a civilian. So far we have impacted around 700 most vulnerable girl children; most of them have been staying with us and few getting groomed for a period of 1 - 6 years and were repatriated seeing the improvement in their family conditions. Thus, we could positively impact around 700 girl children, who otherwise, would have been in bad hands still on the streets, victimized, subjugated, and engaged in anti-social activities. Rainbow Homes Program- ARUN collaborated with CRDS as their local implementation partner to execute, manage Rainbow Home activities in the district of Anantapur in the state of Andhra Pradesh. CRDS has also been associated with Rainbow Homes Program since 2010. We offer services such as protection, shelter, Health, Nutrition, Education, lifeskill, and Career support through the future program. We ensure our children groom and become good citizens through our Rainbow Homes Program which provides holistic and comprehensive care.

EDUCATION

All 120 children are admitted to the school. We regularly ensure that children go to school on daily basis. Apart from the regular school, we provide **Bridge Course and Remedial Classes** are arranged for children to focus and improve the education.



Mr.H.Sreenivas Murthy and Mrs.N.Saraswathi Devi joined hands as volunteer tutors to take care of children's educations this year. Changes were made in the children's study timetable in this period.

All the Volunteers and Education Co-ordinator are well qualified and possess professional education Degree in teaching i.e. Master of Education (M.Ed.) which helps in taking care of children's education needs.

We are happy to share that our all children have passed with Flying colours and are promoted to their next class this year. Four of our Girls are promoted from X to Class XI and One girl from Class XI to Class XII and one girl from Class XII to Craduation.



HEALTH

Health and personal hygiene are vital are in taking care of children in Crescent Rainbow Home. Due to seasonal changes and which is severe summer and the whole of the rainy season, there was minor sickness identified but on account of our preventive measures, no one suffered from severe symptoms of Dengue or malaria, etc., 05 health checkups were conducted this year. Ten children were identified as underweight and special nutritious food is being provided to them.

On the occasion of Doctors Day on 1st July 2017, Snehitha Foundation members organized a Health Camp with a group of 40 Doctors in our Home. As well as they trained children and staff on how to keep their surroundings clean, explained sanitation, and taught how to wash hands before eating and after coming out of the toilet.

Mr.Sanyasi Rao, Deputy Commissioner, Mr.Venkata Ramana, Health Officer District Medical & Health, Anantapur, and their staff like ANMs and Asha health Workers organized a camp to provide awareness on Dengue & Malaria diseases to children and staff. They practically explained how these diseases are born and spread out in our surroundings. Later on, they did Blood checkups for every child.

In the month of August 2017, Government officials had provided Immunization vaccines like Rubella & measles to the children in the schools as well as to our children.

Every child is trained and taught to maintain good personal hygiene both in Balasabhas and other meetings time and again.

Dr. Vasanth from UHC (Urban Health Centre) provided training to the staff on Health on using First Aid Kits and how to avoid mosquitoes in our homes.



We administered DTP injection for immunity and Homeopathy tablets, deworming tablets as a precaution which gave good results. Regular monitoring of Height and weight is going on as per schedule.

In the month of March, the Adolescent Girls Health Awareness meeting was conducted. On this day Health Education Officer Mrs. Parveen visited Home to take an awareness session on Health issues among adolescent girls. She discussed the health issues like menstruation and child marriages. She explained about Adolescent age, changes that can be seen in our body, what are the Dos and Do not's during Menstruation, and how to maintain hygiene during periods.

Mr. Amarnath Reddy, Convener Manavatha Blood Donation Organization, Mr. Bojjappa first class Judicial Magistrate, Mr. Malydri ASP(Additional Superintendent of police), Mr. Subramanyam DCPO (District Protection Office), Rehna begum, Sulthana & Durga Devi, Public prosecutors, inner wheel club team visited the home in this year.



NUTRITION

We have best practices in making a food menu for children. Children will discuss the menu which they want in the "Bal Shabha" keep in mind health and sessional aspects.


Children change the food menu once a quarter. Fruits in the menu were changed seasonal-wise. We provide special food to the underweight children and sick children also their diet is supplemented with bread, eggs, and fruits. We provide chicken once and eggs thrice a week.


In weekly meetings, Home Mothers were trained to keep the Kitchen clean and prepare tasty and nutritious food for the children and take special care in hygiene.

In the month of June, all the children in the Home have been taken to National Park in the outskirts of Anantapur Town for the outing. Children visited Shilparamam and saw the statutes of prominent and historic people. Later on, they enjoyed Pedal Boating, camel, and Horse Riding walking on Water balloons. These outings are also the moments for the children to interact with children of their age group from different places in the town and from outside who come to see the places. Children enjoy it a lot.

In the month of October, children went to pilgrim places of Yellarthi, Devara Gutta, and saw the people following different types of cultures and celebrations on the occasion of Moharram.

ENGAGEMENT WITH FAMILIES

This year, four parents meetings were conducted. Parents were oriented on the need to have children's vital documents and what are they lose for not possessing them and exhorted them to cooperate in procuring them. We also orient parents about the do's and don'ts with the children in the interest of their health, hygiene, and security. The progress and the achievements of their wards are shared with them and they feel happy seeing the progress. Also, they were motivated to do savings for the future of their children. Shikaari parents (a nomadic clan) are now realizing the importance of education and leading a dignified life. Regularly parents are visiting our home to help in the home activities.

Akhila had got 1st prize in a competition drawing on International Child Rights Day the prize was presented by Mr. Prabhakar Chowdary respected MLA Ms. Μ. Swarooparani, Municipal Corporation Mayor - Anantapur Households in Anantapuram town.

They are nomadic people engaging in daily labor and make their children beg and fetch income for them with which they take all sorts of intoxications like alcohol, inhalers, Gutka, etc. There are three kinds of shiakaries they are the Nakkala Shikari, Matti shikari, Neeli Shikari. There is neither much literature nor research done about them and on Govt. teacher did the exploration and came out with the information that they belong to Hubli of Karnataka whose profession is hunting which is in their nomenclature itself. Their language is distinct from their culture and lifestyle too. All the anomie and aberrations are seen in them when a tribe whose abode is supposed to be the forest shifts to urban areas.

S. Akhila had got 1st prize in drawing competition in International Child Rights Day the prize presented by Mr. V. Prabhakar Chowdary respected MLA & Ms. M. Swarooparani, Municipal Corporation Mayor - Anantapur Detested Living Style of Shikaries: Apart from IT, they are engaged in begging, hunting pigs, and birds. Theft is the resultant effect of their wayward lifestyle on account of their living in a town like Anantapuramu. Being nomadic and non serius, they are pleasure-loving and frequent movie viewers. They send their children begging and with the thus earned amount, elders take alcohol. Being intoxicated and quarrel mongers, consequences that follow, they often go to police station owing to frequent quarrels among themselves and with others.

Their self and surrounding hygiene is abominable emanating stink, which makes others keep a distance from them. all these aspects earned them a bad reputation among the local community in the town. So much so that any educational intervention by the Govt teachers likes bridge course or schooling is done separating these children from the best. In this turbulent atmosphere, their children's education and cared would be casualty.

Shikari Children in CRDS Initially: CRDS (Crescent Rural Development Society) is the registered organization that started rainbow home in the year 2010 with a strength of 7 children and presently catering to 113 most vulnerable girl children. 40 children are from shikari communities who are all first-generation learners. I got curious to study this community, after listening to their living condition and the transformation their children had undergone coming her and their path of achievement.

In CRDS home initially, shikari children were nonresponsive and inactive which could be attributed to their social exclusion and the food habits like pork eating, nonvegetarian residuary food items like chicken's intestine, legs, head which are thrown as waste or sold at a throwaway price but high in calories and full of fat.

Resistance of Local Community to The Enrollment of Shikari Children:

Inheriting their parental backgrounds, children's behavior, and mannerism, and life traits were but natural like their parents. It took time for them to get groomed in the home and learn to intermingle with other children. Their talking tone and pitch were also high and their mannerisms were rough, they used to respond only to the high pitch talk. These children's enrolment in the CRDS home invited Resistance from the local community, who perceived Nuisance with their stay and used to talk in a sarcastic tone on the aspect of their education and reformation. But now, they are not able to make a distinction between a shikari and non – shikari child, in spite of their distinct facial features.

The caliber of Shikari Children: Almost all the shikari children are good at drawing and mathematics, which the teachers at CRDS attribute to their money collecting and counting exercise while in begging. Getting adjusted to vegetarian food at CRDS home initially took time for them and they face the problem even today when they return from their parental home after the vacation as they suffer a hangover. Now the highest class of a shikari girl S. Akhila is in 9th class and that landmark day is just 2 years away when Akhila will be the first person to have passed the SSC exam in the annals of the shikari community.

Being nomadic, like many other Rainbow Children, they do not have vital certificates like aadhaar or ration cards due to which their children suffer especially when there is an opportunity for a scholarship from the Govt. or when they go for higher education. But all their parents possess voter ids which leave some scope to get further useful certificates like aadhaar or ration cards.

Renuka: Renuka aged 12 years is studying in the 6th class, in Sharada School. She is studious and good at drawing. She scores almost cent percent in all subjects or else gets 24 out of 25. she Is also good at the dance in folk art forms like chekka bhajana, kolatam too. She doesn't like to go the home for the gear of the atmosphere in her home. Seeing the girl's disliking, parents Retrospect and started reforming themselves. Renuka aims to become a teacher.

LIFE SKILLS

Rainbow State team contacted the 2nd Phase of the Life Skills Training at Styodayam, Tarnaka in Hyderabad for 4 days from 24th to 27th October 2017, which was the continuation of the 1st Phase. This program was mainly focused on the recap of 1st phase training and futures of Adolescent girls, Risky Behaviour, root causes, and Home Values.. Our management coordinator Ms. Irfana and Home Manager Krupa attended it actively.

Later on 28th October 2017, our team had an exposure visit for a day and learned good practices from other Rainbow Homes in Hyderabad.

These life skill session helped our to understand the life skills activities and in turn, contact various life skill sessions to children.



Back at home, all new experiences and learnings were shared with other team members, and they have explained the importance of Life Skills Trainings and how to conduct these trainings with the children and make them understand how it helps them in building up their future.

We started conducting for the children and they are receiving and showing some positive behaviour in them.




CHILDREN PARTICIPATION AND LEADERSHIP

As per the norms of the home, changes were made in children's committees once in months, clubs once in 06 months, and regular sitting of Balasabha take place. child is beholding responsibility in the Home

6 children's clubs were formed i.e. Literacy club, sports club, laughing club cultural club, guardian club & drawing club. These clubs usually do their club work every fortnight.

In the month of December 2017, our home children had won prizes in the Throwball competition at District Level. Our Throw ball sport players are Manoja, Latha, Revathi, Renuka, Vani, Chandini, S. Gowri, S. Ramadevi, and S. Padma. They stood second runners in the competition and got sports certificates in it at the District level.

In the month of Feb 2018, District Level Speech and Drawing competition were held. On the eve of the Swach Bharath Program, at the behest of DEO, an elocution competition had taken place at our Primary School. Nageshwari and Swetha in Drawing and Nageswari, Ayesha, and Yamini in Speech won the prizes.



In Feb'2018 Science Fare exhibition had taken place at Sarada Municipal Corporation Girls High School, Anantapur. Meghana has won 1st prize in elocution on Green House Effect.

In the month of March, an essay writing competition was held at Sarada Municipal Corporation Girls High School, by District Judge. In this Competition, Latha and Dhanalakshmi had won 2nd and 3rd prizes.

During the period Janmabhoomi program had been conducted on this Day. District Rangoli and Dance competitions had taken place. In this, two children from our home had MLA won the prizes. Local Mr.Prabhakar Chowdary was chief guest in this Program. All our children had taken part in Speech, poetry, songs and dance. Legislator appreciated our Director Mr.Saddam Basha for his service to children and the society.

FUTURES - OLDER GIRLS

As a plan for girls' future, in the month of September 2017, girls aged above 16 are undergoing training courses in Spoken English (for 05 girls) and Computer coaching (for 01 girl). All these girls will be provided with proper and basic skills for building their future.

In the month of January 2018, girls aged above 16 are undergoing training courses in Spoken English and Computer coaching as per future plans.

All these girls will be provided with proper and basic skills for building their future. For all the SSC, Intermediate, and Degree girls, future plans were drawn. During the summer camps, they will be provided with soft skills like Computer and Spoken English. Intermediate 1st year girls are provided with live Lab practice so that it would be helpful for their 2nd year course in MLT. Kalpana who had successfully completed Intermediate will be admitted into BSc Nursing. Sucharitha Degree 1st year girl is provided with computer skills and spoken English.



On this day District Education Officer Mr.Janardhana Charyulu had visited the home to give New Year wishes to the children and staff and wished good luck for the 10th pursuing children at Home.

Pongal: In this vacation, it's time for children to learn new skills like Bangles, earrings making, learning art and crafts work and shine their skills by practising them. A dance master name is appointed to teach dance to the children on this vacation. All the children are divided into groups and few songs were practised by them.

Makara Sankranti Sankranti is one of the most auspicious occasions for the Hindus and is celebrated in almost all parts of the country in myriad cultural forms, with great devotion, fervour & gaiety. It is a harvest festival. Makar Sankranti was celebrated in the CRH with great joy and happiness involving all the children in the home. All of them woke early in the morning, had their bath, wear fresh and clean clothes and lit "Bhogi Manta" (bonfire) which is the traditional fire flame as a mark and symbol of the festival. The Staff of the Home and Children were involved in various games like Kabaddi and participated in various cultural shows. Antyakshari programme (songs programme) was the centre of attraction for the children. On the night they viewed movie shows at home. The children had a special meal and at the night they had porridge.

to interact with the key office bearers of the village like Sarpanch and Village Organization leader along with the cross-section of people; both male and female. They were informed about the services of the Mobile Health Care project being jointly run by CRDS organization and Wind World Group. The team discussed the Village Health Committees and their utility with services being offered. Involving key persons of the village Like Sarpanch, MPTC, ZPTC and Anganwadi teachers, Schoolteachers and HM and ASHA workers gave credibility to the project thereby ensuring accessing services by the people in great number.

This awareness had brought the knowledge of health which will last long besides acting as a preventive measure from the deceases. Not only this but this form of awareness reaches many people as they see, read the placard and the brochures and literature and later discuss among themselves which helps in spreading knowledge.

Patients who availed of the services of Mobile Health Van and all expressed satisfaction over the services offered by the project.



OUT REACH OF MOBILE HEALTH CARE

We are happy to share that we would reach out and provide the health related awareness programs and medical support to 14057 adults and 1843 children in 11 villages of Anathapuramu and Kurnool.

Near about 392 clinics were put up by mobile health van to conduct the health awareness program and health camps. These mobile health clinics provided great support especially those who were not connected with the transport and were without adequate medical facilities. This program helped at their doorsteps with no fee and saving a lot of money and man hours and getting back to their daily routine. We feel the ever increasing number of patients every time is the indicator of the utility of the initiative and the place it has won in the hearts of the people. The best part of it is that we focus on prevention by spreading awareness and also if afflicted with disease, we focus on curing. This dual approach is proving beneficial for the people and won the hearts of many.



CASE STUDIES

Ramanjineyulu - Ankireddypalli Village

My name is Ramanjineyulu aged 38 years, resident in Ankireddypalli village. I work in mining and stone crushing works for the past 05 years. Due to my heavy work, I have been suffering from severe body pains, fever and nerve pain. By the day ends, I was not able to do any other work at home. I consulted a nearest Doctor in our village. But he could not help me in getting rid of my pains. I really could not understand my health issue and seek another doctor in Kurnool govt hospital. It was very difficult for me to spare even one day sacrificing my work and go for my health treatment.



In these circumstances, the Mobile Health Care Unit came to our village and I met the Doctor there and explained my problem. After examining my health condition he suggested following some precautions and gave me prescriptions. Diet aim at supplementing the calcium contents in my food by consuming items like Milk, buttermilk, vegetables like cabbage, drumstick. And for blood improvement I was advised to take dates, meat, green peas, peanuts etc., All these will improve protein contents in our body helps in our better health. I followed his instructions and diet plan and now lam feeling much better. There is much improvement in my health and feeling strong, happily going on work and making my family happy. Thank you Wind World Company and CRDS for making our health better.

M.Pullamma - Petnikota Village

lam M.Pullamma, aged 60 years, resident of Petnikota. I work as a daily wage worker in farming, do polishing works and other works for my livelihood. I and my Husband both have to work to fulfill our family needs. One day when we were working in a Factory, I fell down unconsciously. My husband and other people working there immediately took me out from there into the open air. It took 15 minutes for me to come out of the unconsciousness. Every one told my husband to take me immediately to the nearby Doctor. But we were not having sufficient money to go to the doctor. If we spent money for my health that day we will lose food for our children.



CASE STUDIES

In this circumstance, in its turn in the week, Wind World's Mobile Health Care Unit came to our village. Immediately I rushed over there and talked to the Doctor and Staff working there and explained by Health problem to them. Subsequently, the Doctor confirmed that I am having high blood pressure i.e, 240/I30 MM/HG BP. He suggested me to immediately go to the nearest hospitals in Kolimigundla or Tadipatri Govt hospitals for checkup and start taking medicine immediately. Otherwise, it could be a serious problem for me.

Then I immediately went to the govt hospital at Kolimigundla for checkup. They confirmed that I am having B.P and I have to take the medicine after having breakfast regularly. Likewise, I am taking medicines without neglecting them.

The next Wednesday the Mobile Health Van came to our village. I shared my experience in govt hospital with the Mobile Health Van Doctor. He gave some suggestions to follow in my daily routine for my health. Those are

- To avoid stress, tension and pressure
- · To avoid salty and spicy food
- To avoid oily food
- To walk daily 2 hrs, once in the morning and in the evening
- Monthly once I have to go to govt hospital to take B.P checkup and to take medicine regularly

Presently, I am following all these suggestions which improved my health bringing BP under control. I am really happy to have these services at my doorstep.



CREATIVE MINDS

On the occasion of Teachers Day, Wind World Group, one of the leading renewable energy companies in India organised a sensitization campaign for students in ZP High Schools Kogira, Ananthapuramu. Deep Jyothi Bora, CSR Programme Manager visited Kogira Village of Roddam mandal, Ananthapuramu Dist. He visited Govt. School in Kogira village and conducted Drawing competition to the 8th, 9th and 10th class students. Objective of the campaign was to create awareness among the students towards health, personal Hygiene, Sanitation, Cleanliness and Environment Protection. R.O (REVERSE OSMOSIS) WATER PLANT

CRDS and Wind world combination's other landmark initiative was the launching of RO (Reverse Osmosis) water system. RO was installed in the schools of the following villages.

- 1. Venkatampalli
- 2. Chintalayapalli
- 3. Hikyola
- 4. Kogira MPPs and UPPs
- 5. Kambalapalli



It was a very much useful initiative as water is the main cause of all diseases and 80% of diseases are waterborne. Children, parents and the teachers welcomed the move. Now children have got rid of diseases to they suffered from and the attendance in the school has improved. It is being used by students and teachers alike. All of them thanked CRDS - Wind world for installing such a wonderful much needed facility. It is also serving as the model for the entire village who are motivated to get it installed and go for safe drinking water.

Ms. Poonam Pujara visited CRDS NGO for monitoring Mobile Van services and also for the purpose of Short film shooting from 28th to 30th July 2017. According to this, she visited Kogira village of Roddam Mandal of Ananthapuramu Dist on 28th July 2017, visited RO Water plant in a Government school and discussed the RO Water utilization, its functional and upkeep mechanism and its usefulness with the students. Students replied to her questions on how useful it is proving for them. All these activities were shot into the short film including the operating of E-TAB and the usages of E-TAB.



On 29th of July 2017, Poonam Pujara Visited another village of Itikyala of Kolimigundla Mandal, Kurnool Dist, in this village she went to Govt. school and asked about the RO Water plant functioning and its usages, Students replied to her queries which made her felt happy seeing its utility and that gratification in them. During the event, Mrs.Samalamma said that every child living in this home is lucky that they are taken care of by Mr.Saddam Basha who is struggling to make the children contributing citizens. And also said that Education is inevitable to live a better life.

CWC member Mr.Nagaraju visited our CRDS Home to interact with the children and staff and to know the activities going on in the home.
