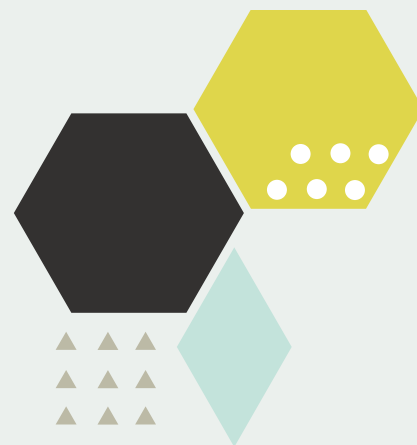

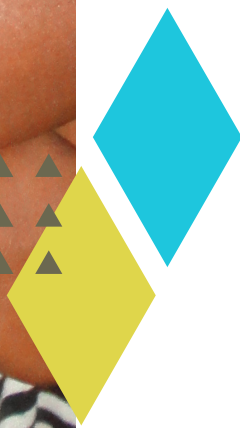

# Introduction

CRESCENT RURAL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY started to work on Rural Development issues since 1993. Initially, CRESCENT RURAL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY worked towards integrated Rural Development aspects in Anantapur Dist. of Andhra Pradesh. Anantapur district has a long and illustrious heritage of voluntarism starting from 1960. The pioneering works of voluntary organizations in the district involve models of organization, mobilization, and unionization of Agricultural laborers, Marginal farmers, marginalized sections of the society i.e. Dalits, and STs integrated Rural Development, Regeneration of women and children, Community health, AIDS Awareness, Watershed Development, Regeneration of De-graded lands and hillocks, etc.

Crescent Rural Development Society (CRDS) is a Non-governmental Voluntary Organization working in Anantapur District for the socio-economic upliftment of the socially and economically deprived people. With its main focus on children, child safety, child education, the organization is committed to the safety and security of the children and their families. The organization is running a Child Care Institution (CCI), exclusively for girls taking care of more than 110 girl children who are coming from deprived communities, single-parent children and parentless children, Homeless children. The "Rainbow Home" program was started in the year 2010 with 5 children in the freely offered house in the Driver's colony of Anantapuramu. Now the home has grown to a strength of 110 children over a period of 10 years with long-term care and protection. Ideally, a Rainbow Home is designed to cater to 100 children. Mostly, at any point of time, we have more than 100 children as we can't afford to ignore vulnerable children seen on the street or referred by a civilian. So far we have impacted around 700 most vulnerable girl children; most of them have been staying with us and few getting groomed for a period of 1 - 6 years and were repatriated seeing the improvement in their family conditions. Thus, we could positively impact around 700 girl children, who otherwise, would have been in bad hands still on the streets, victimized, subjugated, and engaged in anti-social activities. Rainbow Homes Program- ARUN collaborated with CRDS as their local implementation partner to execute, manage Rainbow Home activities in the district of Anantapur in the state of Andhra Pradesh. CRDS has also been associated with Rainbow Homes Program since 2010. We offer services such as protection, shelter, Health, Nutrition, Education, lifeskill, and Career support through the future program. We ensure our children groom and become good citizens through our Rainbow Homes Program which provides holistic and comprehensive care.

# CRDS: GROWING WITH CONFIDENCE

CRDS was founded and envisions building a child-friendly society. The organization seeks sustainable solutions to long-term problems of 'street and working children' through the Rainbow Home approach that reinforces civil society as well as a government initiative. Through an array of empowering measures, it works to open opportunities for children and improve their living conditions. We, at present, are engaged working with over 100 formerly street children and working children.

To ensure a safe and happy childhood of vulnerable children on the streets to help them to access protection, education, nutrition and health care.

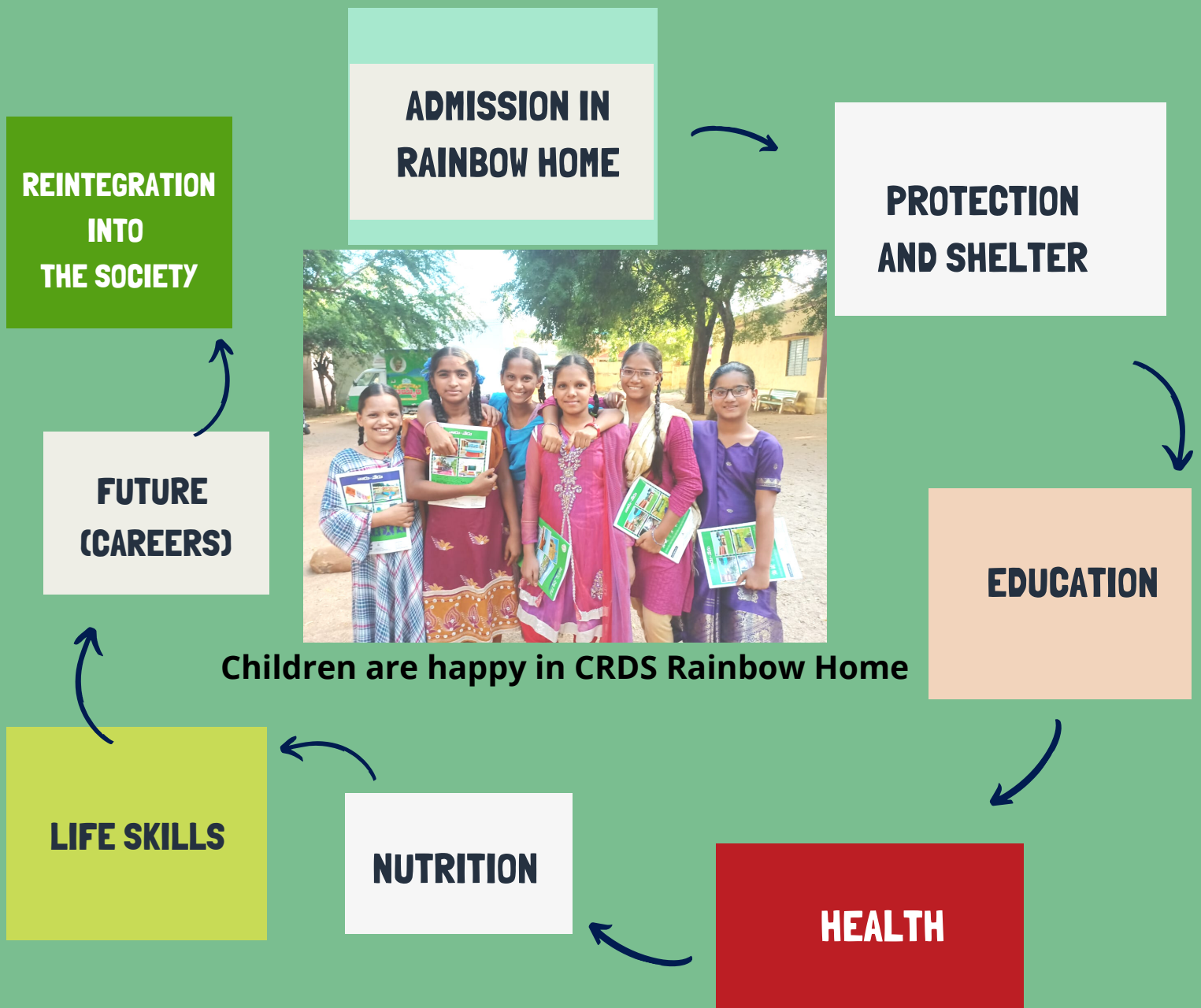

# Comprehensive Care

## EDUCATION

The Home took the utmost care to ensure that the children are taken care of by all means –with a special focus on education, health, and all-round development. The home presently has the strength of 110 children who are studying in different classes.

We regularly ensure that children go to school on daily basis. Apart from the regular school, we provide **Bridge Course and Remedial Classes** are arranged for children to focus and improve the education.

All the Volunteers and Education Co-ordinator are well qualified and possess professional education Degree in teaching i.e. Master of Education (M.Ed.) which helps in taking care of children's education needs.

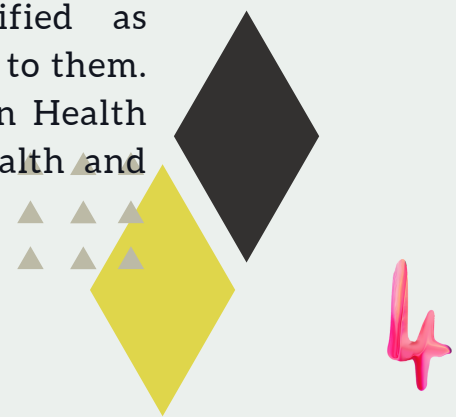
This year all the 11+ years aged girls are admitted into nearby KGBV hostels as per the Government orders, Children are joined into 3 KGBV residential schools and Model School (College) for Intermediate girls.

## HEALTH

Health and personal hygiene are the vital aspects being taken care of in Crescent Rainbow Home. Due to seasonal changes of transition from severe summer into the rainy season and major period of reporting being in the rainy season, there was minor sickness identified among the children. But on account of our preventive measures, no one suffered from any severe illness.



06 health checkups (Dental check-ups, Blood, General Gynaec, General Health check-ups and Eye check-up) were conducted during the period. Fourteen children were identified as underweight and special nutritious food is being provided to them. Some of the Nurses and Lab Technicians from the Urban Health Centre, Anathapuramu arranged a camp for general health and blood checkups.



Mr.Sudhakar and Team members from Janashiksha Samsthan visited the home and conducted awareness program on Sanitation. They explained children and staff about the cleanliness of surroundings and taken pledge with children on Swach Bharath (clean India) mission.

They also explained about personal hygiene and the use of toilets and did Plantation in the premises. They said everyone has to plant at least a single tree in their compound and must use Toilets so as to keep clean surroundings and a clean society and a clean country.

Dr.P.Vijayalakshmi, MBBS, from DHMO and Team came to conduct a medical check-up camp and discussed the gynecological issues. They taught children good habits like early wake up brushing teeth, body exercise, taking bath daily, wearing washed clothes, etc.

Deputy Commissioner, Health Officer District Medical & Health Office in Anantapur and their staff like Nurses and Asha health Workers came to organize a camp on providing awareness on Dengue & Malaria diseases to the children and staff. They practically explained how these diseases are born and spread out in our surroundings. Later on, they did Blood check-ups for every child.

In the month of August, Government officials had provided Immunization vaccines to the children in the schools. Every child is trained and taught to maintain good personal hygiene both in Balasabhas and other meetings.

A Team from UHC (Urban Health Centre) came to provide training to the staff on using First Aid Kits and how to avoid mosquitoes in our homes.

In December month, a General Health Check-up camp was organized in the Home with the support of the Government Hospital. "Sputum Test & 'X' ray" for 110 children have been conducted and to our happiness, all were tested negative.



After the check-ups, they trained children and staff about how to clean our surroundings and taught us how to wash our hands before eating. Also, they provided awareness on Dengue, cholera, malaria.

Some of the children were identified as underweight and special Nutritious food is being provided to them.



# NUTRITION

We change the Menu every three months. Weekly once we are providing Non-vegetarian food to children and eggs twice in a week. Seasonal fruits are also provided to children once in a week. If children are sick, we give lite food like java, leafy vegetables and for underweight children

Ragi malt, Dry fruits, Milk, seasonal fruits and proteins food. In weekly meetings, Home Mothers were trained to prepare tasty and nutritious food for the children and to take special care in hygiene.

Food committees at Home are helping Home mothers in keeping the kitchen clean, and also promote hygienic practices among children like washing hands before eating, cleaning vessels and cups and plates in hot water once a fortnight.

## EXTRA CURRICULAR

### ART

During the summer holidays, arts like painting and dancing were organised in the Home. All our children actively participated in these two types of Arts. Ameena madam trained our children in Arts. They learned and improved their skills. One of our children named Shobha painted on a cloth beautifully.

We appointed dance masters named Lakshmikanth and Munna to train children in dance. Now our children can practice dance on their own and acquired good skills in it.





During Dasara Holidays two types of arts like Drawings and paintings were organized in the home. All the children in the home took active participation in it with the help of teachers. They learned better colouring and improved their skills. As a part of this program, children made paintings on postal cards and delivered them to the visitors conveying those Dasara wishes. With this activity, all the children got compliments for their wonderful art

work and the way they conveyed their wishes to the visitors. Mr.Bojjappa, retired magistrate, R.Sasikala, Novelist, Sudhakar, Visitor, replied by saying that they felt very happy when the children sent them festival wishes.

## CRAFTS

Our children have an excellent talent for crafts. They can make paper flowers with paper, make thread bangles, earrings with silk threads. They prepared all these materials with their own talent and creativity.



## DANCE

In the month of August, our Home children have participated in elocution and poetry and won prizes & certificates on the occasion of "Telugu Language day held in their Schools.

In the month of October, a Dance Master Mr.Lakshmikanth is appointed to teach dance to all the children at Crescent Rainbow Home.

## OUTING AND EXPOSURE VISIT

In the month of August, all the children in the Home have been taken to Iscon Temple and National Park in the outskirts of Anantapur Town for an outing. Children visited Shilparamam and saw the statutes of prominent and historic people. Later on, they enjoyed Pedal Boating, camel and Horse Riding walking on Water balloons. In these outings, children interact with other peer groups from outside and enjoy.



## OUTDOOR EDUCATION: Karate

Increased confidence is something that martial artists of all ages enjoy. Whether it's for you or your child, martial arts can help you improve your confidence. In fact, children who participate in karate or a similar martial art show improved confidence and even better performance in school.

So, We have appointed a master named Sharmas vali to teach karate to all our children at Crescent Rainbow Home.





## Futures- olders girls

### Udaan

In the month of August, a workshop on Udaan plan for adolescent girls was conducted at Yercaud in Tamilnadu. The Project Director, Home Manager, Accountant and all the young girls from CRDS Rainbow Home have attended this workshop. This was the 3 days workshop on Udaan plan for young girls. On the first day, all the girls were asked how they express their happiness and sadness. They were also asked about their future plans and their career plans after leaving Rainbow Homes.

Second Day of Workshop- Today's session was about Humanity, Love, Care and qualities of Goodness. That day was also discussed about the future plans of young girls and how do they want to look at themselves after 30 years from now. They were also taught about the good qualities and bad qualities and anger management.

The third day of the Workshop started with a recap of the earlier sessions. All the girls were asked to write about Education plans, Living arrangements, individual plans, group living and future plans. On 4th day, all were taken to visit Metturu Dam for excursion.

## Ramzan Celebration

In the month of June, children celebrated the Ramzan festival. On that day they woke up early in the morning and wore new clothes. Our Project Incharge Mr.S.Saddam Basha had explained the importance of Ramazan to the children. They ate Biryani and Kheer (dessert) and enjoyed the whole day by playing games and watching movies.

## Krishnashtami Celebration

On the occasion of Krishnashtami on 03rd September children were dressed like lord Krishna and Radha and played the game of breaking the pot (utti) which made every moment enjoyable. Later on, children did dancing and singing and celebrations went on for the whole day.

## Christmas Celebration

On this day, Bhogi fire was lit and children went around it singing. The home team had explained the importance of Bhogi. Later children were served with Pulagam and chutney. Children felt very happy on this day.

On the day of Sankranti, Children got woke up early in the morning and then wore new dresses after having a head bath. Children also made beautiful and ornate drawings and patterns on the ground with chalk or flour, called "Rangoli" or "muggu" in front of the Home. These drawings are decorated with flowers, colours and small, hand-pressed piles of cow dung, called "gobbemma" Children were served with variety of dishes on this day. Later staff explained the importance of Sankranti festival to children.



## Republic day Celebration

Republic day is a national festival in India when people celebrate this great day of honor by hoisting the national flag. On this day, the Constitution of India came into force. On this day 4th town police Station ASP, Staff came to Rainbow Home to celebrate Republic Day. After hoisting of National Flag, children gave beautiful speeches. The police staff had given awareness to children on toll freed number 100, national Heroes like Mahatma Gandhi, Nehru, and Bala Gangadhar. Children pay tribute to all the freedom fighters who sacrificed their lives for the nation.



## Women's day Celebration

On this day, our children shared wishes with each other. PI Saddam sir explained the importance of Women and the context of the celebration of women's day to all our children. After that Home staff held the essay writing competition for children. Later prizes were distributed to winners.

The next day, our staff visited Amanvedika Homes at Musheerabad and Medibavi. There we observed and learned so many things which will help us. After came back home, and discussed and reviewed it with the other staff.



# Life skills

Mr. Hussian Basha sir representative of the Juvenile Justice Board came to Rainbow Home to give training on Child Rights. Sir discussed the Rights, Right to Freedom, Right to live, Right to protection. Sir had given awareness on how to improve Human values among children, to overcome pressure, talked on the importance of education, career and job in our lives and how to choose and set goals.

Our Home staff had explained about Life Skills to children. Topics like self-confidence, Right to Education Act were explained. Children listened carefully and learned these topics.

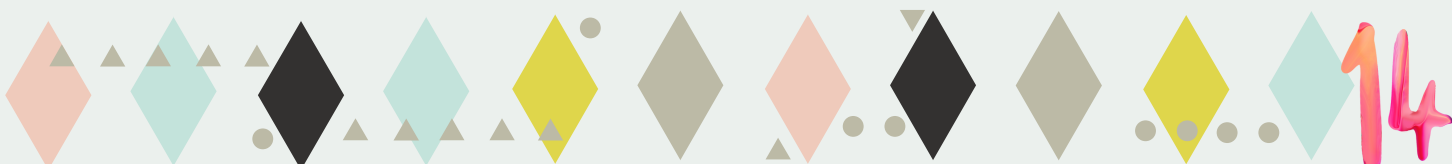
On May 18th Nageswari madam had given training on life skills to our children at Crescent Rainbow Home. She explained about value education, personality development.

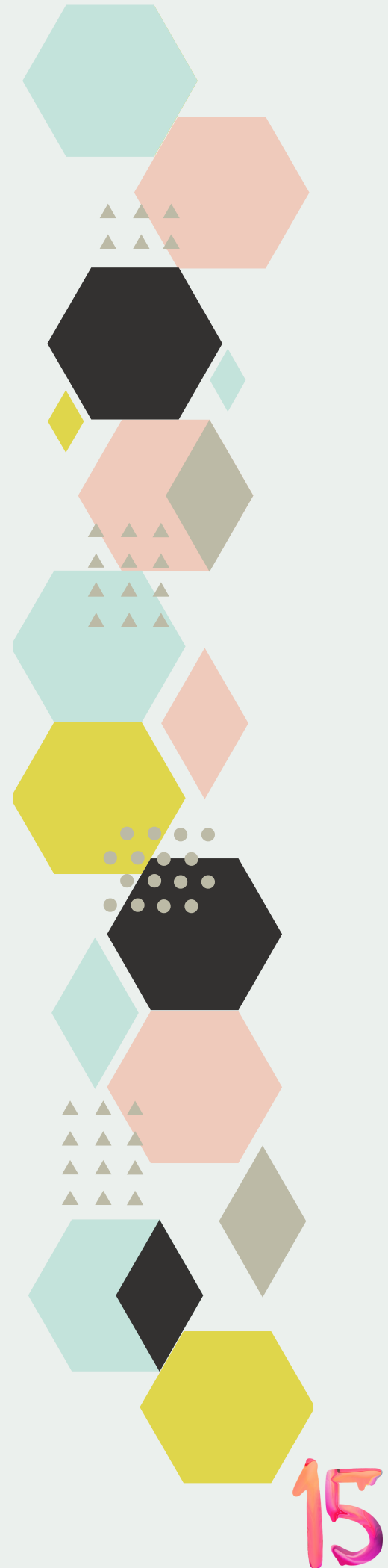

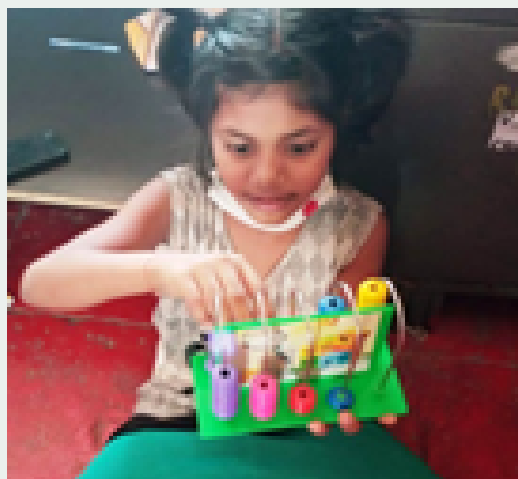
### Creative Minds

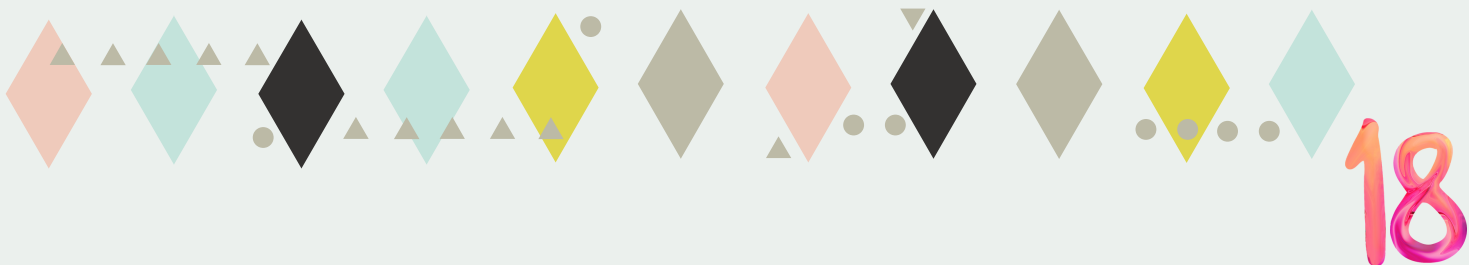

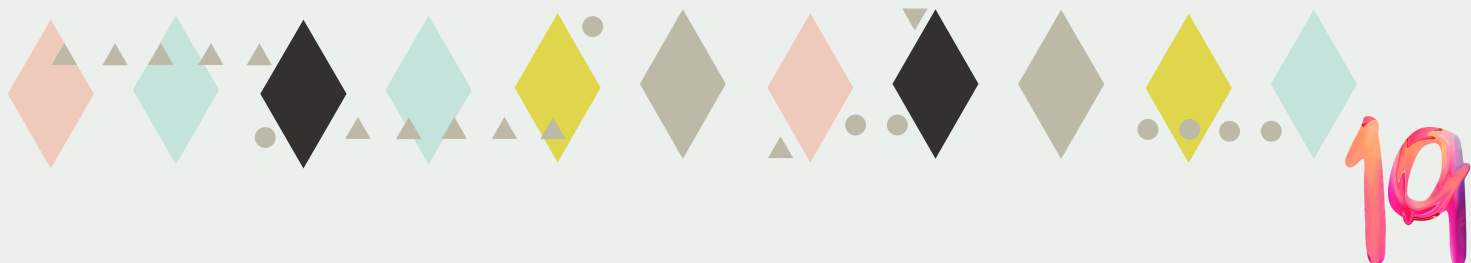

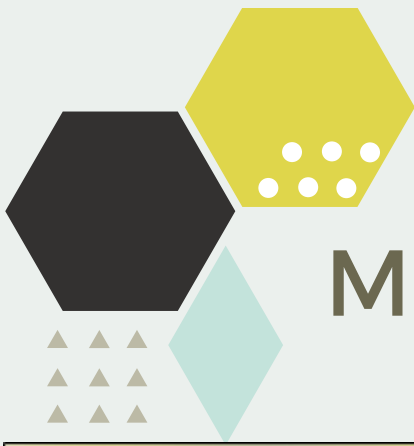
## RO installation in schools
